

## ***Requirements, Guidelines and Conditions***

### **Depositing of Materials on a Council Street**

The Burnie City Council may grant a permit to allow the deposition of materials on part of a Council street, including the tracking of material from land or premises adjoining the street, or the spillage of liquid or solid materials from a vehicle travelling on a local street.

Any depositing of materials on a street within the Burnie municipal area must comply with the following requirements in accordance with the *Burnie City Council Highways By-Law No 3 of 2013*.

*NB – This document is to be read in conjunction with the General Terms and Conditions.*

#### **Permit**

- a. The Council must be satisfied that the depositing of material is unavoidable in the circumstances of the application and that all appropriate actions will be implemented to assist to reduce impact of the disposal, including provision for cleaning of wheels and containment of materials;

#### **Risk Management**

- b. The depositing of material must present no immediate danger or risk to safety of other users of the highway or to the occupiers of land adjoining the highway;
- c. The nature of the material must not cause or be likely to cause environmental harm or environmental nuisance, and does not constitute a pollutant;
- d. The nature of the material is such as not to present immediate or unreasonable risk of damage to the condition or structure of the highway;
- e. If there is potential for material to enter the stormwater system, then appropriate measures must be implemented to manage discharge. A catchment barrier may be required around the material, and measures installed to prevent or filter stormwater discharging into gullies;
- f. The applicant must demonstrate satisfactory measures will be taken and provided a management plan to monitor impact and to remove material without delay so as to maintain the highway in a safe, functional and sound condition;
- g. The applicant must demonstrate a satisfactory risk management plan in respect to other highway users, including the provision of warning signs and traffic control measures; and
- h. The Council must be satisfied the applicant has the resources and the capacity to manage the situation and to remove the material from the highway in an effective and timely manner.

A person seeking to deposit material on a Council street must complete an *Application for Conduct of an Activity or Work within a Council Street*, and obtain a Permit from the Council.
