2022/2023 Cruise Ship Season

Commencing on 5 November 2022, the City of Burnie returns to being an active destination for visiting Cruise Ships.

During this time, Burnie expects to welcome 33 Cruise Ships and an estimated 48,000 visitors and 23,000 crew members.

Why are Information Sessions being held?

Information sessions are being held to provide an overview of Council's changed role and responsibilities for Cruise Ship visits following changes to our service delivery model.

Sessions will provide community members with an overview of volunteering activities that will be available through Council during Burnie's 2022/2023 Cruise Ship season. This will include previewing the content and technology that will be used in the new Visitor Experience Centre to support and supplement the Volunteer network and their communications with Cruise passengers. It will also be an opportunity for Volunteers to ask any questions.

When are Information Sessions planned for?

Sessions will be held at Braddon Hall in the Burnie Arts and Function Centre. Light refreshments will be available. 'Zoom' links will be available for anyone wishing to participate in the sessions remotely.

Do Volunteers get paid for their service?

Volunteers do not receive any form of remuneration for their service. Volunteering is a contribution of time, effort and talent without financial gain. Council recognises its volunteers through a dedicated "Volunteer Thank You" function each year.

What happens after the Information Sessions?

Induction and orientation sessions will be held during October to ensure registered volunteers can successfully undertake their relevant volunteering activity.
